Important Cookie Sale Dates to Remember!

January 7	Pre-orders begin!
January 30	Last day to take pre-orders! Turn in order card to leader
February 25	Leader picks up cookies to pass out to girls
Early March	Deliver pre-order cookies
March 3	First day of booth sales
March 26	Booth sales end / money due to troop

How can I help my troop leader?

- Talk to your leader and ask how to help
- Offer to plan a cookie activity at a troop meeting
- Volunteer to help pick up cookies on delivery day
- Offer to assist in girl cookie order sorting after delivery
- Help with booth sales at stores
- Help in the collecting and depositing of money (if signer on bank account)
- Help sort the girls' cookie rewards
- Help plan the celebration at the end of the sale!

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2023 Cookie Sale Selling and Safety Tips for Parents



Walk your neighborhood. Ask your Troop Leader for <u>door hangers</u> to use in case people aren't home! If you're on a military base, door to door sales are <u>not allowed</u> so try visiting local businesses or apartments in town.

Craigslist, military sales pages, and public Facebook accounts are off limits for advertising the sale of cookies.

Review past order cards, or Nut Sale order cards, and call old customers to see if they would like to buy cookies this year! Take your daughter to work and let her give a sales pitch to your co-workers! Or use a sign, video email, or poster she made to get the word out.

Girls can email or text their friends and family to let them know they are taking orders for cookies!

When making pre-order deliveries, have extra cookies on hand in case your customers want to purchase more!

Many do!

Ask for a Gift of Caring donation if they can't eat the cookies or they don't want any cookies. Know who your troop is donating to!

Never let the girls sell alone, they always need an adult. If they're a Cadette or older, they can buddy up with another Girl Scout.

Girls can only sell only during daylight hours. Try selling on the weekends to maximize daylight hours.

Your daughter should always wear her Girl Scout uniform while selling to show her Girl Scout pride. Plan ahead to handle money while delivering. Make sure to deposit funds to leader frequently.
